SALISH EAGLE ON FINAL LEG OF JOURNEY TO B.C.

VICTORIA – BC Ferries newest vessel, Salish Eagle, transited the Panama Canal overnight on March 5 and is now on its way home to British Columbia.

The vessel departed Gdansk, Poland on February 11. It is currently on its way up the West Coast of North America. The voyage is going very well and the ship is expected to arrive by late March.

For those who want to join the voyage "virtually", customers can track the ship's progress including course, position and speed at <u>www.vesselfinder.com</u>.


